Gov. Nikki Haley to deliver Republican Address Following SOTU:

After a year when a church massacre and catastrophic flooding put her in the spotlight, South Carolina Gov. Nikki Haley will get further national exposure when she gives the Republican response to the State of the Union address. But she's not new to the national stage. In 2012, she spoke at the Republican National Convention and campaigned for past GOP presidential nominee Mitt Romney.

Note: Haley, who attended funerals for all of the massacre's victims, has said the event motivated by "pure hate" will "forever change the way I live my life." In calling for the flag's removal, she acknowledged the differing views that for years prevented politicians, including herself, from even broaching the subject.

Note: "My hope is that by removing a symbol that divides us, we can move our state forward in harmony," she said.
