[WEBINAR] Alcohol Misuse in the Military: Screening Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment

July 23, 2015; 1:00-2:30 p.m. EDT

According to the DoD 2011 Health Related Behavior Survey, approximately 33 percent of active duty service members reported binge drinking in the past 30 days, higher than the civilian estimate of 27 percent. Several interventions for alcohol use disorders exist, but many of these approaches are too intense for sub-threshold alcohol misuse. The Screening, Brief Intervention and Referral to Treatment (SBIRT) model, promoted by the U.S. Preventive Services Task Force in 2013, is a comprehensive, integrated, public health approach to the delivery of early intervention and treatment services for persons with alcohol use disorders. The SBIRT model enables healthcare professionals to systematically screen patients with the goal of preventing the negative effects of alcohol use among service members and beneficiaries.
