Description/Significant Features:

The houses at 214 Bomway St. and 166 Cherry St. are examples of the single-family type compact Ranch house in the Barnwell Heights Neighborhood. These one-story houses have side-gable roofs clad in asphalt shingles, clapboard siding, and continuous concrete block foundations. The symmetrical facades have a central entrance flanked by one-over-one double-hung windows. Window type and placement and porch types vary among these types of houses in the neighborhood.

Historical Information:

These houses are located in the Barnwell Heights Neighborhood, which was established in 1951 to provide worker housing for the nearby NRHP-eligible Savannah River Site (SRS). It was designed by the South Carolina architectural firm of Lyles, Bissett, Carlisle & Wolff in partnership with Atlanta-based landscape architect and planning consultant Eugene R. Martini. The neighborhood was built following the passage of Public Law 139, "The Defense Housing and Community Facilities and Services Act," which spurred the construction of housing developments built in communities around the SRS.
