That "heritage" cannot be for the fi state, surely. The remaining Nazi's in Germany (or today's skinheads) must wax nostalgically at the illegal to display the Swastika) vs. our ability to romanticize such a similar symbol as theirs.

And I wonder if that is the sum of what you can understand needs doing.

So I stand and publically ask you:

-where is your full courage to lead in the performance of the public trust of the office that you occu start/oblige and organize the necessary journey of the people of South Carolina to a more complete understanding of why such an act as this can occur in this state, whether they believe they are read; understand the need to do so or not? It is you, is it not, who must remind us of what makes us bette should take us beyond our own narrow understandings to see the better future, as you say, for Sout

duty and that your advisors hold your "best interests" at heart and they counsel that you shy away from this persistent and complex issue that is in real denial in all of us to such an extent that it is around the world as the "American dilemma"?

-I've recently read a published letter of a very hopeful (for us) South African living in the US and how the South Africans worked to deal with apartheid via an imperfect yet honest process of "truth reconciliation", a process that asked them to face their violent, racially-divisive past; a process that leadership from all sectors of the country: police, legislative, private and religious. And, as we well South Carolina are implicated in that period for South Africa in that much of the Apartheid system structured from the South's Jim Crow system .yes, that "Crow" was ours.maybe not made by you or surely and sorrowfully, a part of our heritage as well!...and I have asked myself why we cannot find that we do have to do the same. Or, have we forgotten that such is possible for us? Is leadership afraid of "necessary"? Is today's leadership afraid of "leading"? Is leadership misunderstanding it has to act in order to "earn" respect?

To paraphrase Pogo: I've seen the enemy and it is us in our denial [at all levels?] in such matters! -Isn't it time to stop asking the victims to forgive, allowing the rest of us to forget and remain distant and demand that we all work to deal with this, knowing that this is a civic and community "problem/duty"? Wouldn't we want to more so teach our children how we "got over" and came thru this to better than struggle to explain how, in a "free society such issues are "complex and difficult" and therefore challenging to take-on? .is that us, our "American way"? Is "duty to country" only for that military you and we should be so proud of?

This is not a matter left for our church leadership to deal with. They cannot do it alone. Rather, it is YOU and the legislature as the highest state representatives of our public trust and aspirations to take and to LEAD ALL OF US in, involving other leaders as you see fit.

To paraphrase Zorba (the Greek) who, when he asked why people, why the young, die and was told a question over which scholars could only agonize without answer, responded; "I spit on their agony, as he, regarding our so-called "difficulty in an open and democratic society" to organize to thoroughly such an issue, the resolution of which would so clearly free us to move, with all of our admired and energy for fairness and progress, into a truly better future, no doubt, an example to other communities throughout the world. In the absence of leadership and vision, we follow what "false and lesser gods I always understood that , as Americans, we did not have to be bound by nor afraid of our past,that capable of choosing what matters to us, unlike so many other cultures, facing it and moving-on. But a psychiatrist will tell you, you can't really "move-on" without facing your fears, etc. To paraphrase (Confucius) what you don't face within yourself, you are obliged to face in the world,that is what karma/fate is. Sikh spiritual tradition well knows.

Why not South Carolina? We've been first in many things, since the founding of this country,including times the most problematic,why not be first among others again but this time in an inclusive and more progressive and positive direction? Acknowledging our past honestly, making peace with it, we will leave it behind and to honestly and wholeheartedly move forward, making South Carolina the "go to" much wants to be but can never be without this resolution.And we should do so in helping those who such falsehoods to find new and more positive ideals.

I openly, and hopefully on behalf of ALL South Carolinians,challenge you, Governor Haley, to step elected/sworn duty to lead and begin/organize a sincere and sustained effort to surface and oblige a Carolinians to better learn/deal with the truths of the race/inequality issues that persist in this state; surely will involve what we will teach our children (via civics classes and discussions, and town meetings for example), who will otherwise inherit this "confusion" and be asked to endure more of these totally tragedies.
