The US Department of Energy now plans to truck the 6,000 gallons of extremely radioactive waste (150 truckloads), in liquid form, to the Savannah River Site in South Carolina, in exchange for \$60 million from Canada. This liquid radioactive waste includes cesium-137, strontium-90, iodine-129, plutonium-239, and weapons-grade uranium-235, left over from the production of medical isotopes at Chalk River, Ontario, north-west of Ottawa. The waste was previously determined to be solidified and stored onsite in Canada.
