Governor's Proclamation

- WHEREAS,** the Holocaust was the state-sponsored, systematic persecution and annihilation of Jews by Nazi Germany between 1933 and 1945; and
- WHEREAS,** while Jews were the primary victims, gypsies, the handicapped, the Poles, homosexuals, Jehovah's Witnesses, Soviet prisoners of war, political dissidents, and many others also suffered grievous oppression and death under Nazi tyranny; and
- WHEREAS,** the history and the personal accounts of survivors of the Holocaust reminds us to reflect on the responsibilities of individuals, societies, and governments in the face of great injustice; and
- WHEREAS,** annual Days of Remembrance and Holocaust Remembrance Day provide an opportunity to remember the victims of the Holocaust while reflecting on the need for respect of all people; and
- WHEREAS,** the 2012 Days of Remembrance and Holocaust Remembrance Day serve as reminders of the tremendous power of individuals to make a difference in the lives of others.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Nikki R. Haley, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim April 15-22, 2012, as

DAYS OF REMEMBRANCE

and April 19, 2012, as

HOLOCAUST REMEMBRANCE DAY

throughout the state and encourage all South Carolinians to remember the victims and honor the survivors of the Holocaust, as well as their liberators, while working to overcome the intolerance and inhumanity that continue to exist in the world today.
