## Comments

This project involves the construction of a sidewalk at Riverfront Park that will link a sidewalk on the west side of the parking lot to one about 180 meters southwest. A cultural resources field survey was done on 1/31/19. It consisted of a pedestrian reconnaissance augmented by the excavation of four shovel test pits. No archaeological remains were found. Background review indicated two previously recorded cultural resources nearby, the NRHP listed Columbia Canal, and site 38RD232, an unevaluated precontact/19th/20th century historic site. Neither resource will be impacted by this project. In addition, the Central Correctional Institution (CCI) once stood just south of the APE. It was recorded in a county-wide survey as Site 1153 and listed on the NRHP. In 1999 the complex was demolished except for a portion of brick wall in the north and a stone retaining wall along the canal. A site revisit card was compiled for the extant wall segments (1153.02) as part of this undertaking. One new cultural resource was recorded (Site No. 7915). This site, a relocated one room schoolhouse, was evaluated as NRHP eligible but will not be adversely affected by the proposed sidewalk. No further cultural resources investigations are recommended.

Effect Determination:

This screening form was developed to satisfy documentation requirements for Type I and Type II projects under a Programmatic Agreement between the Federal Highway Administration, the South Carolina State Historic Preservation Office, the US Army Corps of Engineers, and the South Carolina Department of Transportation. For Type I and Type II projects that have no effect on historic properties, the completion of this screening form with supporting documentation (e.g. ArchSite Map) provides evidence of FHWA and SCDOT's compliance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act.
