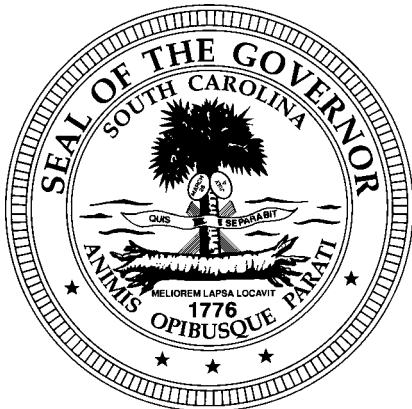
## *Proclamation*

- WHEREAS,** South Carolina is blessed with a rich history of significant contributions to our nation's struggles for the attainment and preservation of the American ideals of freedom and democracy; and
- WHEREAS,** on the 28th of June, 1776, the Battle of Sullivan's Island was the first victory of the Patriot cause during the American Revolution; and
- WHEREAS,** a sizeable British fleet and army had been defeated in a decisive way and British pride was seriously wounded, thus significantly boosting American morale; and
- WHEREAS,** the 2002 observance of "Carolina Day" provides a unique opportunity for citizens throughout South Carolina and the nation to celebrate the significance of the Battle of Sullivan's Island and the legacy of freedom it helped secure.
