- WHEREAS,** by working together to raise public awareness of the devastating effects of childhood cancer, we can make a positive difference for families, patients, and survivors in the future.


**NOW, THEREFORE, I,** Jim Hodges, Governor of the Great State of South Carolina, do hereby proclaim September, 2001, as
