Holly,  
I have received and reviewed the refugee resettlement numbers received the Bureau of Population, Refugees and Migration. The data reflects that in the in the current federal fiscal year (Oct. 1, 2015, through April 30, 2016), 115 total refugees have been resettled in the state from nine countries: Belarus, Bhutan, Burma, Dem. Republic of Congo, Eritrea, Iraq, Moldova, Syria and Ukraine. Of those individuals, 61 are male and 54 are female. Consistent with prior reported information, to date, only two individuals of Syrian national origin have been resettled in the state. If you have any questions or want a further breakdown of the data, please let me know.
