Background On Interview:

With two trials in Charleston set to begin soon, the New York Times wants to talk to a handful of people - the governor will be the only elected official - about how the crimes being litigated have impacted Charleston and the entire state.

-- Where the people of the state are in the process of healing, what they learned from the crimes and issues surrounding them and where they go from here.

-- Not emphasizing the criminals or the crimes, but rather the moment in South Carolina and

Charleston since the eyes of the nation and world focused on the state so intently during this period last year - and those eyes will be back on the state during these trials.

-- This is not a political story. Political desk and political editors will have no role in the concept or editing process of the story.
