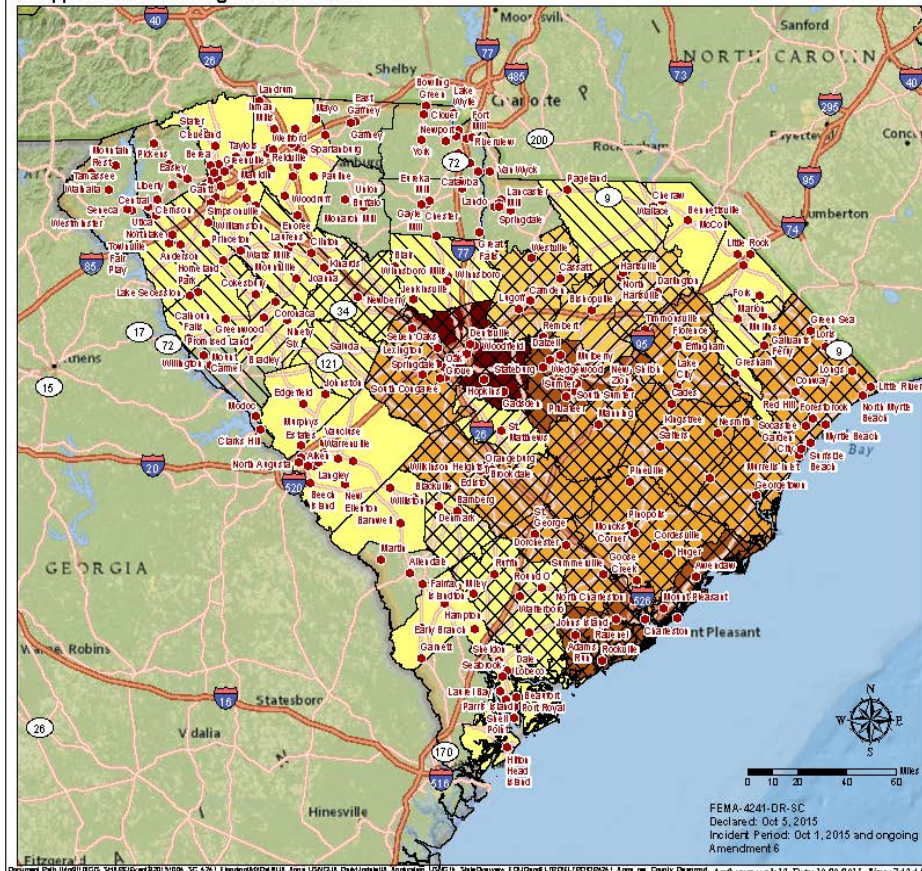

Overview of Hazards

Current Weather: Mostly sunny, with a high near 76. East wind 3 to 8 mph.

NWS Warnings:

- Flood Warnings remain for the Santee River near Jamestown and the Edisto River near Givhan's Ferry

Situation Overview

- Designated counties: 29 (26 PA, 22 IA)
- Marion and Fairfield Counties were designated for Individual Assistance on 10/20/2015
- Lee County was added for Public Assistance on 10/20/2015
- 19 fatalities (8 traffic, 11 drowning)
- Incident: 10/01/2015 – ongoing

- 6c. Provide accessible disaster recovery services to individuals, households and the private sector to include registration and case management, and coordinate with whole community partners to address unmet needs.**
- 11. Assess and assist in the coordination of the removal and disposal of debris.**
- 2d. Inventory and provide technical assistance in analysis and evaluation, prioritization, and conduct emergency repairs on identified structures and critical infrastructure, including roads, bridges, dams, water and waste water treatment plants, and water distribution systems.**
- 13a. Assess state, tribal, and local mitigation capacities and strategies and provide resources and technical assistance.**
- 14a. Assess the factors that contributed to disaster effects and develop a strategy to educate about risk reduction opportunities, including flood plain and insurance technical assistance to local officials and communities.**

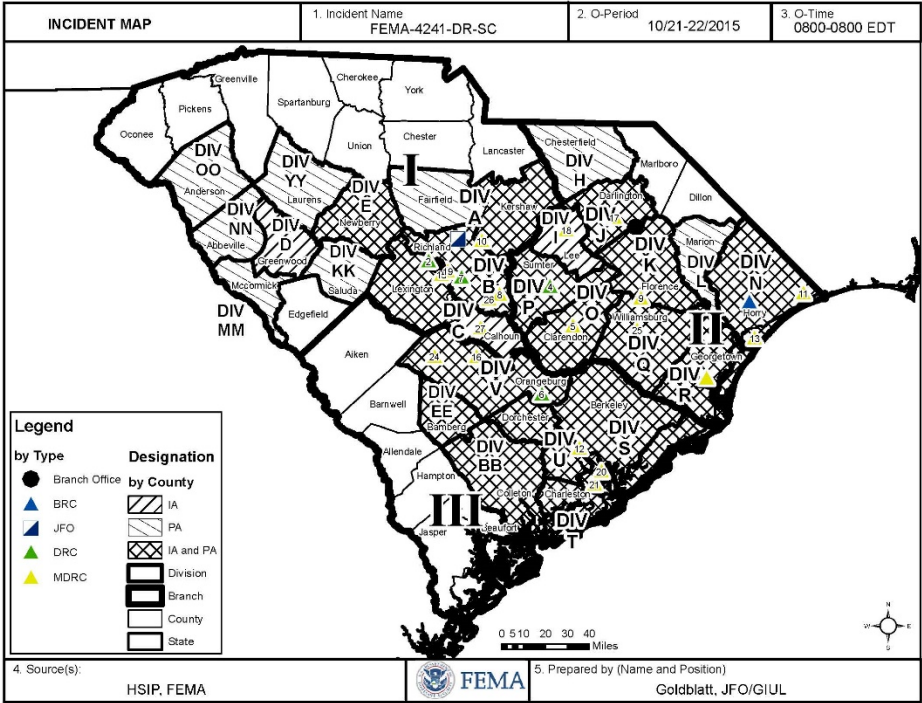

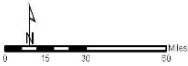
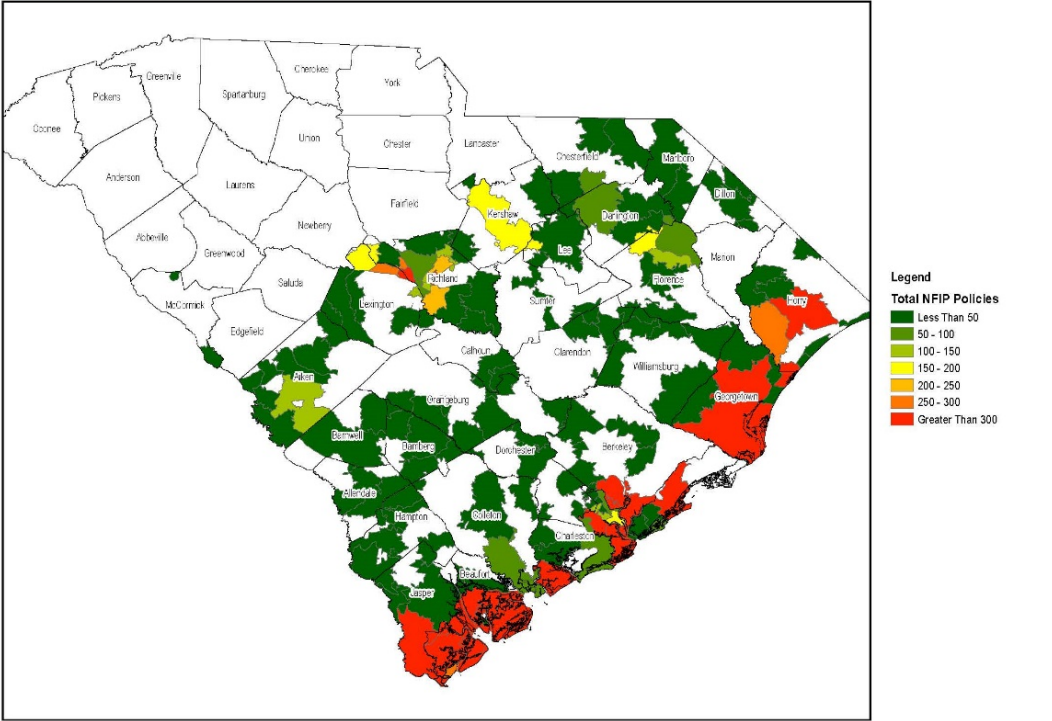

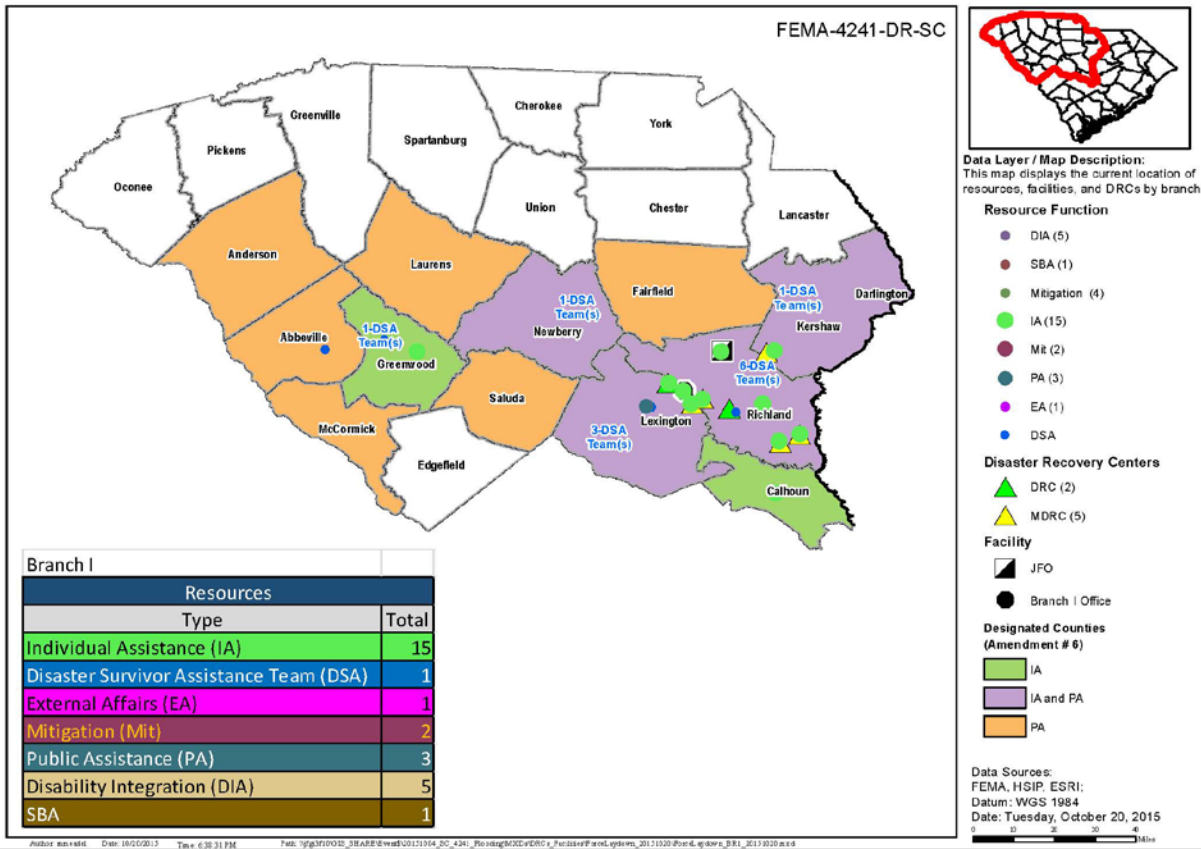

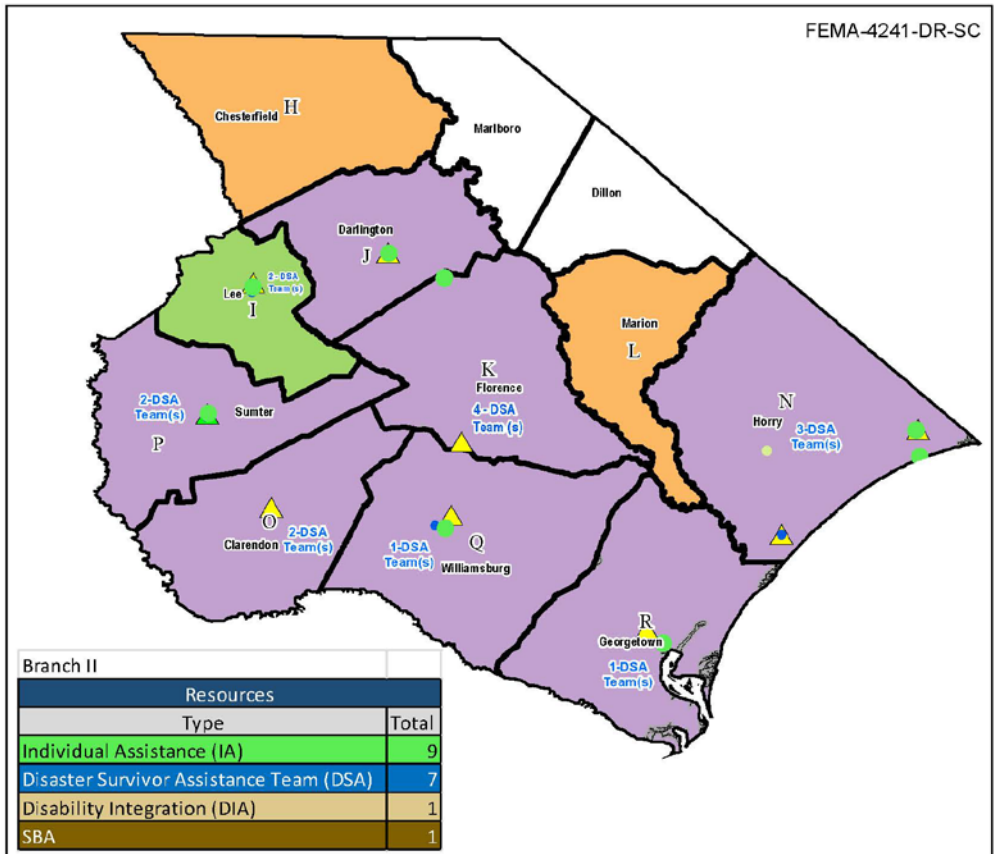


South Carolina - Force Laydown: Branch I (0800-0800 10/20-21/2015)

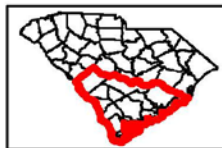
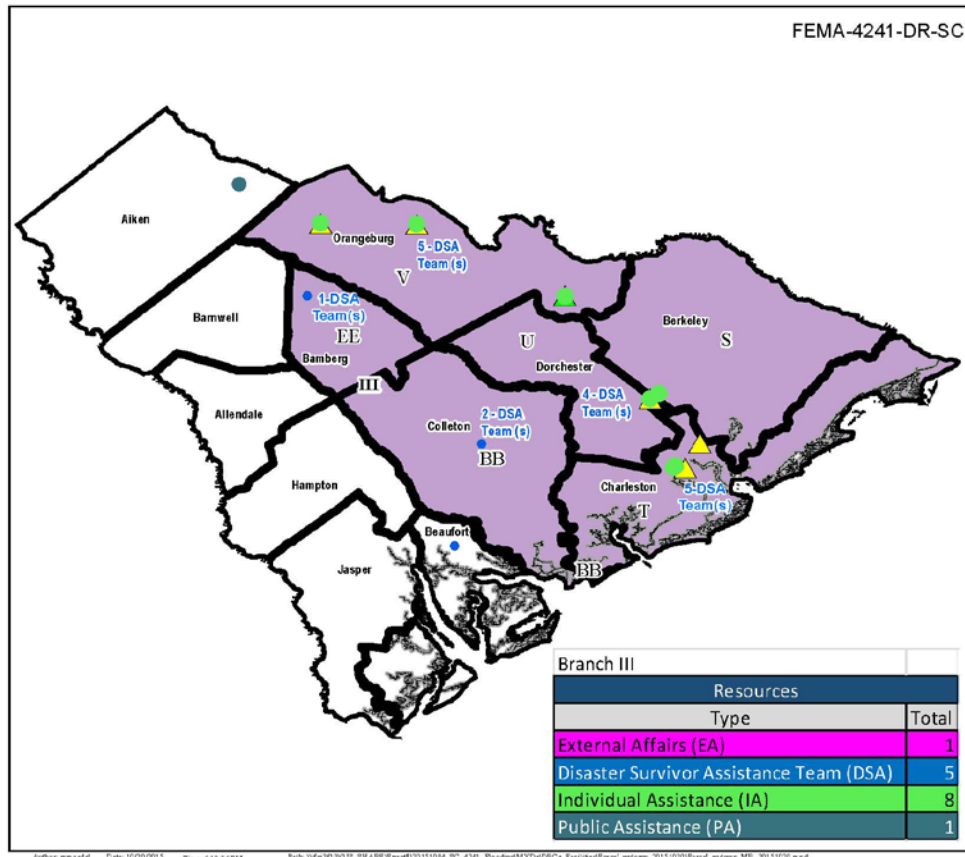

Emergent Issues: Roads and Bridges

Sumter County:

- 15 state, 1 county and 1 federal roads are flooded. 12 roads are washed out. 1 bridge structure is washed out
- 1 bridge replacement on S-44 is needed. The Cains Millpond Dam (D1578), Lake View Pond Dam (D1917), and Ellerbees Mill Pond Dam (D1460) breached. There is no threat to public safety

Lexington County :

- 46 roads are damaged. Source is South Carolina DOT and Division C Supervisor

Richland County:

- 86 roads are damaged. Source is South Carolina DOT

Georgetown County

- 4 State, 2 washouts. Pennyroyal Rd. closed until after 11-26-15
- All roads to Big Dam Swamp open, Pine Tree Landing closed.
