TIDBIT TUESDAY - ON WEDNESDAY! From the log cabin at Sesqui, to the Lodge at Table Rock, you can find many unique buildings within South Carolina's State Parks. One building, once you have visited it, might end up being one of those unforgettable buildings for you. It's Lee State Park's "Bird House". It's an elevated outhouse the Civilian Conservation Corps built on Mulberry Island along the Lynches River. It's elevated because during very heavy rain events, the Lynches River can flood Mulberry Island. This outhouse originally served as a restroom for 3 fishing cabins but these cabins were taken down in the 1960s. The next time you're headed to Lee, make sure to visit Mulberry Island and see the CCC "Bird House" outhouse.
