**Indian Economic Times:** Why Indian Americans are in favour of Donald Trump

The 2016 Republican National Convention at Cleveland, Ohio, last week had its share of hits, misses and drama for the Republican presidential candidate Donald Trump. The convention also saw some high profile support for Trump from the India American community, which has historically leaned towards the Democratic Party. Organised under the Republican Hindu Coalition, an Indian American lobby group that was launched late last year, prominent supporters of Trump hosted former speaker of the US House Newt Gingrich and Abhay Patel, Republican candidate for US Senate from Louisiana, for a breakfast during the RNC in Cleveland. “Through the Indian American advisory council of the House Republican conference, we will campaign for Trump as president and feel that when we educate Indian Americans about his policies they will be able to understand that he will be a far better president for them than Democratic candidate Hillary Clinton,” national chairman of the RHC Shalabh (Shalli) Kumar, Chicago based businessman, told ET.

**NOTE:** He is now responsible the victory of Republican Party in Arizona, an exercise that includes more than 40 different races – Presidential, US Congress and US senate, Arizona. “The Indian American community was very well represented at the RNC 2016 with former governor Bobby Jindal and Governor Nikki Haley,” he added. Significantly, on the second day of convention, a Sikh prayer was recited at the start by California lawyer and Republican Party member Harmeet Dhillon.

Seeking to avoid a televised display of disunity, Bernie Sanders on Monday urged supporters to line up behind Democrat Hillary Clinton and claimed victory in deposing and sidelining a top party official. Some of his supporters jeered in disapproval, indicating turmoil at this week's Democratic National Convention won't end with the departure of the party chairman, Rep. Debbie Wasserman Schultz of Florida. Speaking to his convention delegates, just hours before the Democrats opened a convention to nominate his primary rival, the Vermont senator tried to settle roiling tensions between his supporters and the party rank-and-file lining up behind Clinton. A fresh email controversy, appearing to show bias by party officials against Sanders, has made that task harder just as the national spotlight turns to the Democrats' rally behind Clinton. "Brothers and sisters, this is the real world that we live in," Sanders told his audience, raising his hand in an effort to quiet them. Republican nominee Donald Trump is "a bully and demagogue," he said, who must not win the White House.

**Associated Press:** FBI investigates DNC hacking; Clinton campaign blames Russia

The FBI said Monday it is investigating how thousands of Democratic National Committee emails were hacked, a breach that Hillary Clinton's campaign maintains was committed by Russia to benefit Donald Trump. A statement from the FBI confirmed that it is "investigating a cyber intrusion involving the DNC," adding that "a compromise of this nature is something we take very seriously." Wikileaks posted emails Friday that suggested the DNC was favoring Clinton over her rival Sen. Bernie Sanders during the primary season. Clinton's campaign pointed to a massive hacking of DNC computers in June that cybersecurity firms linked to the Russian government. Clinton campaign chairman John Podesta added fuel to the debate Monday, saying there was "a kind of bromance going on" between Russian President Vladimir Putin and Trump. The Clinton campaign says Russia favors Trump's views, especially on NATO.

**Associated Press:** Pro-Sanders demonstrators march in the sweltering heat

Hundreds of Bernie Sanders supporters and other demonstrators marched down Philadelphia's Broad Street in the sweltering heat Monday afternoon just ahead of the opening of the Democratic convention, chanting "Nominate Sanders or lose in November!" and "Hey, hey, ho, ho, the DNC has got to go!" The growing crowd of about 400 made its way from City Hall toward the convention site, 4 miles away in south Philadelphia. The protests took shape amid a punishing heat wave, with oppressive humidity and temperatures in the mid-90s. The Fire Department handed out bottled water, and at least one woman taking part in the demonstrations was put in an ambulance by stretcher. Severe thunderstorms were in the forecast for late afternoon and early evening. The demonstrators espoused a variety of causes, including economic justice, socialism and marijuana legalization.

Philadelphia following their breakfast meeting, which ended with remarks from U.S. Rep. Keith Ellison, D-Minn., an early Bernie Sanders supporter who now says the party must unite to defeat Donald Trump. Before the conclusion of the program, S.C. Democratic Party Chairman Jaime Harrison implored delegates to be on their best behavior during the Democratic National Convention, beseeching them to be respectful of view points with which they disagreed and not mouth off to the media to vent frustration. "We saw what happened last week," Harrison said of the moments of discord at the Republican National Convention in Cleveland. Last Wednesday, U.S. Sen. Ted Cruz, R-Texas, got booed off the convention stage when his prime time speech made no mention of Trump. As Harrison spoke on Monday morning, DNC Chairwoman Debbie Wasserman Schultz was being shouted off the stage by her own delegation breakfast. The U.S. Congresswoman from Florida will resign at the end of the week after emails were leaked showing collusion inside the DNC to undercut Bernie Sanders in his efforts to wrest the Democratic nomination from establishment favorite Hillary Clinton. Sanders, a U.S. Senator from Vermont, is meeting with his pledged delegates at 12:30 p.m. today to discuss next steps for his campaign. Many of South Carolina's 14 Sanders delegates are expected to attend.

South Carolina Democratic Party Chairman Jaime Harrison called for all 53 of the state's delegates to link arms on Monday in support of Hillary Clinton, the party's presumptive presidential nominee, even as 14 of them will cast ballots for Bernie Sanders. During a lively breakfast meeting at the delegation's Philadelphia hotel, Harrison described the discord between Sanders and Clinton supporters as nearly identical to the tension on display eight years ago after Clinton suspended her prior presidential bid to endorse then-Sen. Barack Obama. U.S. Rep. Cory Booker of New Jersey reiterated the call to unite. Doing so would show the American public a stark contrast with last week's Republican National Convention, he said. "We saw the darkness, the negativity, the divisiveness. We saw a party that had no unifying idea but the fact that they wanted to try to arrest their opposition like a third-world country," Booker said. "We are here for a different reason." Repeating advice passed down from his grandfather and father, Booker told delegates to respond with grace in the face of trash-talking opponents.

Hillary Clinton appealed for veterans' support during a speech at the VFW Convention in Charlotte Monday, where she also repeatedly criticized rival Donald Trump's statements and positions without mentioning his name. It was Clinton's second appearance in Charlotte this month, and came three days before she's set to accept the Democratic nomination for president. Trump, speaking in Winston-Salem Monday night with Gov. Pat McCrory, is scheduled to address the VFW on Tuesday. Their repeated visits to North Carolina highlight the state's importance as one of the few battlegrounds that could go blue or red in November. The candidates are virtually tied in North Carolina, with Clinton enjoys a 2-point advantage in the state – well within the margin of error – according to Real Clear Politics' polling average. Speaking before a near-capacity crowd in a room set up to hold 6,000, the former secretary of state recalled her father's service in the navy during World War II and her work with veterans while serving as a Senator from New York.

Almost 10 months after historic rains drenched South Carolina, 23 roads around the state remain closed because of dam failures. The Times and Democrat of Orangeburg (<http://bit.ly/2akA8uR>) reports that 15 of those dams are regulated by the Department of Health and Environmental Control. DHEC spokeswoman Cassandra Harris says the agency is providing assistance to the owners of the dams so they can make final decisions on whether they want to repair them. The dams involved are considered low-hazard dams that cause minimal damage if they fail. Whether an owner decides to remove or repair a dam, they must get a permit DHEC permit for the work. The storm last October dumped 2 feet of rain in some areas of the state and destroyed or damaged more than 38,000 homes.

**Aiken Standard:** DHEC confirms 24 travel-associated Zika cases in South Carolina

As of Monday, the S.C. Department of Health and Environmental Control says there are 24 reported cases of the Zika virus in South Carolina. Robert Yanity, DHEC's public information officer, confirmed on Monday there are now 24 reported cases, despite DHEC's website saying there have been 23 reported cases. All cases in the state have been travel associated, and one of those was through sexual transmission. There is currently no local transmission of Zika, according to the agency. A recent outbreak of the virus in South America led the Centers of Disease Control to issue travel advisories to countries where there has been active transmission of Zika, DHEC states on its website.

**Post and Courier:** Amid police shootings, man shot 12 times in infamous chase aims to change 'shots fired' reporting

The man who was shot a dozen times by police in one of the most infamous car chases in local history wants to change the way authorities report "shots fired" calls over the radio. By all accounts, Ron Burris should have died Aug. 23, 1999. He was shot at 48 times after leading police on a six-hour chase through multiple jurisdictions and ultimately crashing in West Ashley. While he takes full responsibility for what happened, Burris said if the initial "shots fired" call to dispatch was clarified to say an officer was shooting at him and not vice versa, he may not have taken so many bullets. "I believe there should be a specific code; I fired shots at the suspect and the suspect was hit or the suspect is firing shots," Burris said. He added that he is disturbed by the current state of police shootings, and every time he hears "shots fired," it hits close to home.

Charlotte Hornets majority owner Michael Jordan is once again in the news for giving away money, this time in response to the racial unrest between African-Americans and the law enforcement community. In a lengthy letter published Monday on the The Undeclared Web site, Jordan said he is giving \$1 million each to two organizations that he says are working to build trust between blacks and law enforcement: the Institute for Community-Police Relations, launched in May by the International Association of Chiefs of Police, and the NAACP Legal Defense Fund. "I was raised by parents who taught me to love and respect people regardless of their race or background, so I am saddened and frustrated by the divisive rhetoric and racial tensions that seem to be getting worse as of late," Jordan is quoted as saying. "I know this country is better than that, and I can no longer stay silent. We need to find solutions that ensure people of color receive fair and equal treatment and that police officers – who put their lives on the line every day to protect us are – are respected and supported."

Eleven states now offer gasoline below \$2 a gallon, with South Carolina offering the lowest prices in the nation. The average price motorists are paying for gas in the Palmetto State, with its low gas tax, stands at \$1.83 a gallon after dropping another 4 cents during the past week. Motor club AAA puts the price a penny higher. The price in South Carolina is 50 cents less than this time last year and about 33 cents higher than the low of \$1.50 reached during the slow winter-driving season.

Nationally, the price fell 4.5 cents last week to \$2.15 a gallon. That's about 57 cents lower than last year at this time.

**The State:** Wrecks on South Carolina roads kill 10 during weekend

South Carolina Department of Public Safety officials said there were 10 road deaths reported between July 22 and July 22. Officials said nine of the deaths occurred on U.S. routes, S.C. roads and secondary roads and another occurred on an interstate. In five of the deaths, officials said a seat belt was not used. Three who were killed used seat belts. A pedestrian and an unhelmeted motorcyclist made up the other two deaths. As of Monday, 513 people have died on state highways, compared to 534 highway deaths during the same time period in 2015. Of the 337 motor-vehicle occupants who have died in 2016, 169 were not wearing seat belts. Sixty-nine pedestrians have been killed compared to 62 during the same time period in 2015. Seventy-four motorcyclists have been killed compared to 83 this time in 2015. Eleven bicyclists have died in 2016 compared to nine this time last year.

Sun Belt Conference Commissioner Karl Benson won't rule out Big 12 expansion plans affecting his own conference. Still, Benson called the Sun Belt's planned membership "perfect" in terms of geography, and he stressed that he envisions a period of stability in which member institutions will enjoy budding regional rivalries and see their football programs prosper. "I truly hope that we can focus on 2016, what we know, what we can control, what we can achieve - and not get bogged down in speculation and rumors about conference membership," Benson said Monday in his state-of-the-Sun Belt address at the conference's annual preseason football media day. "Obviously, if the Big 12 or SEC or ACC made that phone call to a Sun Belt president or chancellor, he or she would be foolish not to have that discussion.

**NOTE:** Football-only members Idaho and New Mexico State are leaving the Sun Belt after 2017. Coastal Carolina, now in transition from the NCAA's Football Championship Subdivision to the Football Bowl Subdivision, becomes a full football member in 2018. At that point, the Sun Belt will have 10 teams in seven Southern states: Alabama (South Alabama and Troy), Arkansas (Arkansas State), Georgia (Georgia Southern and Georgia State), Louisiana (Louisiana-Lafayette and Louisiana-Monroe), North Carolina (Appalachian State), South Carolina (Coastal Carolina) and Texas (Texas State).

**Associated Press:** 2 bodies recovered after 8 fall overboard on Lake Moultrie

Authorities in South Carolina say the bodies of two men have been recovered after eight people were

tossed into Lake Moultrie in a weekend accident. Berkeley County Coroner Bill Salisbury said in a news release that the bodies were recovered Monday. Capt. Robert McCullough of the state Department of Natural Resources says the people were tossed into the water when the boat they were in made a sharp turn about 8 p.m. Saturday. Six people were rescued by a second vessel. Searchers including divers and helicopters searched Sunday for the missing men. Salisbury said the bodies of 51-year-old Jake Williams and 46-year-old Nathaniel Hawkins were found Monday after the search resumed. The coroner says both men drowned. The boat captain is charged with boating under the influence.

Police in South Carolina say they were able to find a man wanted in a double homicide because he was wearing a GPS device after an earlier burglary conviction and his arrest on attempted murder charges. Myrtle Beach Police Lt. Joey Crosby told local media outlets that 29-year-old Calvin Derrell Ford of Myrtle Beach was arrested Sunday and faces two counts of murder and weapons charges. The charges stem from a Saturday night shooting following an argument outside a city fire station. A police report says firefighters heard gunshots and then pounding on the station door. They found two critically injured men identified as 26-year-old Dameion Hakeem Alston and 27-year-old Marquis Jamal Burgess, both of Myrtle Beach. Both died later at a hospital.

**Associated Press:** 2 dead in shooting at Florida nightclub's 'teen' party

Gunfire erupted at a nightclub hosting a swimsuit-themed party for teens in Florida, leaving two teens dead and at least 17 other people wounded, officials said Monday. It was not immediately clear what triggered the violence, but authorities said the shooting was not an act of terror. Police detained three people and were searching for others, interim Police Chief Dennis Eads said. The slain teens were 14-year-old Sean Archilles and 18-year-old Stefan Strawder, police said. Archilles lived about a mile from the nightclub, and loved to play football and basketball, said his father, Jean Archilles. "He liked to make people laugh. He's a funny kid. He's always joking," Jean Archilles said. Strawder starred on the basketball team for Lehigh High School, averaging more than 15 points a game as a junior, according to The News-Press. "Everyone was afraid to play against him because he was so good. He would guide you and give you advice on how to step up your game and how to guard him and things like that," said 16-year-old Peyton Hebon, who started playing against Strawder in travel basketball leagues in sixth grade.

Michael Jordan is trying to help ease tension between African-Americans and law enforcement. The NBA great and Charlotte Hornets owner said Monday he is giving \$1 million to the Institute for Community-Police Relations and \$1 million to the NAACP Legal Defense Fund. The aim is to help build trust following several shootings around the country. "As a proud American, a father who lost his own dad in a senseless act of violence, and a black man, I have been deeply troubled by the deaths of African-Americans at the hands of law enforcement and angered by the cowardly and hateful targeting and killing of police officers," Jordan said in a statement. "I grieve with the families who have lost loved ones, as I know their pain all too well." Jordan's father was killed in 1993 in a botched carjacking in North Carolina. Daniel Green and his friend Larry Demery were convicted of killing 56-

year-old James Jordan along U.S. 74 and dumping his body in South Carolina. Both were sentenced to life in prison.

**Associated Press:** IS attacker: Germans "won't be able to sleep peacefully"

A Syrian man who tried unsuccessfully to claim asylum in Germany pledged allegiance to the Islamic State group and vowed the nation's people "won't be able to sleep peacefully anymore" in a cell phone video before blowing himself up outside a wine bar, wounding 15 people, authorities said Monday. The assailant set off a backpack laden with explosives and shrapnel Sunday night after being refused entry to a crowded music festival in the Bavarian city of Ansbach because he didn't have a ticket. It was the fourth attack to shake Germany in a week, and the second claimed by the Islamic State group. Three of the attacks were carried out by recent immigrants, rekindling concerns about Germany's ability to cope with the estimated 1 million migrants registered entering the country last year, an influx that has since dwindled as the flow of newcomers slowed. Bavarian Interior Minister Joachim Herrmann said a laptop with extremist videos was found at the apartment of the suspect, a 27-year-old Syrian identified only as Mohammad D in line with German privacy laws. A video on his cellphone showed him declaring loyalty to the Islamic State group and announcing a "revenge act against Germans because they are standing in the way of Islam."
