WTW focuses on fighting poverty in South Carolina. This event will gather select partners and members from around the state to work together on a comprehensive strategy for alleviating poverty and deprivation.

At this year's summit we expect approximately 150 participants representing direct service organizations, advocacy groups, faith communities, state agencies and governmental partners, educational institutions, and individuals that have experienced living in poverty.

It is our hope that WTW will generate meaningful and significant conversations. Coming together, we will forge new pathways to fight poverty in South Carolina.



The Summit emphasizes two strategic objectives in line with CMA's Vision 2020:

1. *Develop leadership and legislative commitment*
2. *Increase awareness, accessibility and equity for impoverished communities*

Our agenda consists of six Focus Areas organized around these two objectives.

We encourage participants to join a Focus Area (see below) where their respective agency or organization can provide insights into current challenges and potential opportunities. The work groups will formulate actionable plans for all participants to implement in their organizations.

Strategic Objective One: Develop Leadership/Management/Legislative Commitment

1. Inter-Agency Partnership

Identify key performance measures to assess effectiveness of collaboration of interagency collaboration.

2. Data Management

Discuss ways to collect and share data related to poverty in the state.

3. Poverty Policy Agenda

Lay the foundation for creating a poverty policy agenda that addresses poverty and deprivation in the state.

Strategic Objective Two: Increase Awareness, Accessibility and Equity

4. Community Engagement and Advocacy

Lay the foundation for creating a plan that engages and educates minority communities regarding programs and services that address poverty in South Carolina.

5. Equity in Public Education

Discuss and develop ways to ensure a performance based education is in place.

6. Criminal Justice System Disparity

Discuss and lay the foundation for developing processes to eliminate criminal justice system disparity in South Carolina.

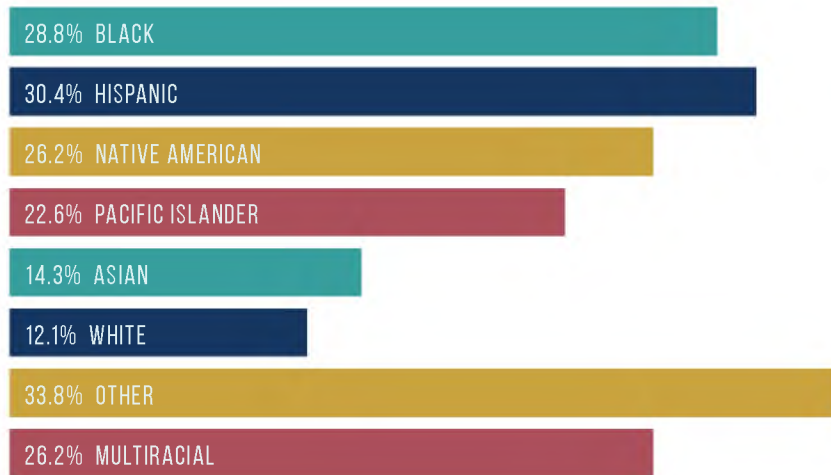
