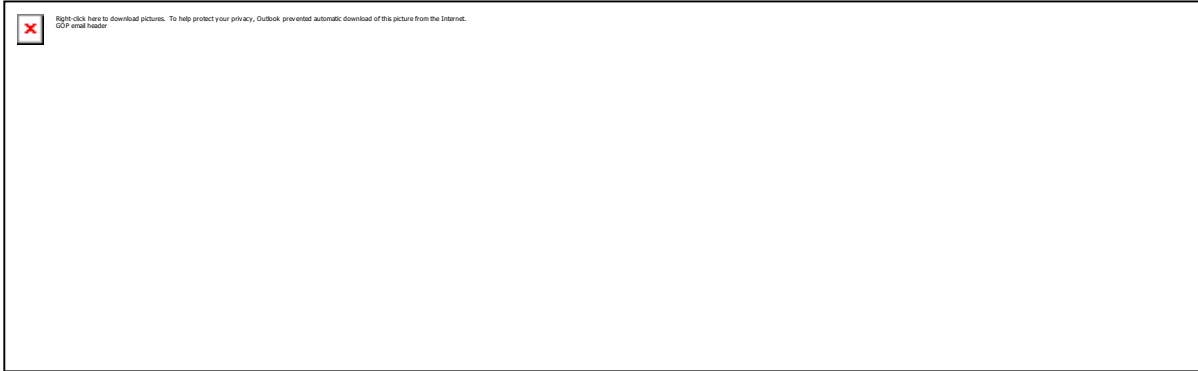

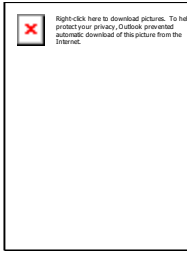

Please join us on Monday evening, August 22, for the monthly meeting of the Waccamaw Neck Republican Club. All are welcome to attend.

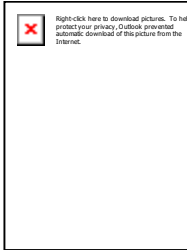
The meeting will feature a full report from the locals who attended the Republican National Convention, including the stories the media did not tell you about!
