South Carolina's unemployment has risen nearly half a percentage point after three straight months without change, state officials said Monday. The state's jobless rate rose to 5.7 percent last month, the Department of Employment and Workforce said in a news release. That's up from 5.3 percent, which had been South Carolina's unemployment rate since April.

South Carolina's unemployment rate increased to 5.7 percent in July from 5.3 percent in June, marking a shift upward after little change in the second quarter, state officials said. Jobless figures increased in all of South Carolina's 46 counties and was highest in Bamberg County, at 12.1 percent.

South Carolina's slowly decreasing unemployment rate over the past several months hit bottom this summer and is now rising. The jobless rate rose to 5.7 percent in July after holding steady at 5.3 percent in May and June, the S.C. Department of Employment and Workforce said Monday. In the Charleston metro area, the unemployment rate also climbed, rising to 5.6 percent from 5.1 percent.
