Parkland School Shooting Survivors to Hold Town Hall in Charleston on July 31st.

CHARLESTON, SOUTH CAROLINA – Lowcountry Students for Political Action is excited to announce that the Road to Change bus tour, organized by the students who created the March For Our Lives in Washington DC, will be coming to Charleston on July 31st for multiple events.

During their time here, students from Parkland and the Charleston area will hold a town hall at the Sottile Theatre (44 George Street) in Downtown Charleston. Check in will begin at 6 and doors will open at 6:30. The event will last from 7 to 8:30 that evening. The town hall will consist of an hour of moderator questions followed by a half-hour of audience questions. The panel will consist of 4-5 students from Parkland alongside 3-4 LSPA (Lowcountry Students for Political Action) members. More information about the program for the town hall can be found on the March For Our Lives website (marchforourlives.com) For security purposes, we require that those who are planning to attend register for the event for free at <https://www.eventbrite.com/e/road-to-change-town-hall-charleston-tickets-48407698730>. Guests will have their bags checked by security when they check in. To make that process as smooth as possible, we encourage attendees to bring small bags.

Parking will be available in the St. Philip Street garage and other garages in the vicinity of the theatre.

Prior to the town hall, there will be a press conference hosted by JA Moore, who is currently running for State House District 15, in the lobby of the Sottile Theatre at 5:00. More information will be sent out tomorrow directly from Moore in a press release.

At 5:30, there will be a historic interaction between the Marjorie Stoneman-Douglas shooting survivors and the families of the victims of the Emanuel AME shooting. Both groups will sit down for a private roundtable to discuss their experiences and the situations they have faced due to gun violence. The

press and the public will not be allowed to view that interaction. This is to preserve the privacy of the participants and the genuineness of the conversation. The press will be able to ask questions before and after the event takes place. We thank you for your cooperation in advance.

We thank the March For Our Lives for coming to Charleston and working with us to organize this unique event and we thank the College of Charleston for hosting us.
