Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services

2017 Supplemental Security Income & Spousal Impoverishment Standards

On December 2, 2016, the Center for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) released the 2017 Supplemental Security Income (SSI) & Spousal Impoverishment Standards. "Certain Medicaid income and resource standards are adjusted beginning each January in accordance with changes in the SSI federal benefit rate (FBR) and the Consumer Price Index (CPI)." The informational bulletin provides a detailed chart that displays the new standards.

CMS Office of the Actuary Releases 2015 National Health Expenditure

On December 2, 2016, the Center for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) released the 2015 National Health Expenditure. "The report concludes that 2015 expenditure growth was primarily the result of increased use and intensity of services as millions gained health coverage, as well as continued significant growth in spending for retail prescription drugs. Spending on prescription drugs increased 9.0 percent in 2015, lower than the 12.4 percent growth in 2014, yet significantly higher compared to 2.3 percent growth in 2013. On a per-enrollee basis, overall spending increased by 4.5 percent for private health insurance, 1.7 percent for Medicare, and 3.8 percent for Medicaid."

Department of Justice

Office for Victims of Crime and the Elder Justice Initiative Announces Solicitation

The Department of Justice (DOJ), through its Office for Victims of Crime and the Elder Justice Initiative, announced that it intends to release a \$3.25 million solicitation in the early months of 2017, which is entitled OCV FY 17 Field-Generated Innovations in Addressing Elder Abuse and Financial Exploitation. The DOJ anticipates releasing the solicitation in the second quarter, or the months of January, February, or March. The grants will be broken into three broad categories, including: Combating Elder Abuse and Financial Exploitation; Increasing Justice for Older Americans, and; Remedying Elder Abuse and Financial Exploitation.

MACPAC Releases 2016 Edition of MACStates Medicaid & CHIP Data Book

On December 8, 2016, the Medicaid and CHIP Payment and Access Commission (MACPAC) announced the release of their December 2016 edition of the *MACStates: Medicaid and CHIP Data Book*. The Data Book acts as the annual update from the commission of national and state-specific data for Medicaid and the State Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP). "The 2016 edition of MACStats compiles data on Medicaid and CHIP that policymakers need to understand how Medicaid and CHIP operate at the federal and state levels. Federation of American Hospitals

Report: Estimating the Impact of Repealing the ACA on Hospitals

On December 6, 2016, Dobson DeVanzo & Associates, LLC, released a report produced for the Federation of American Hospitals (FAH) and the American Hospital Association (AHA) entitled Estimating the Impact of Repealing the Affordable Care Act on Hospitals. The report estimates the financial impact on American hospitals if the ACA is completely repealed and not replaced. Dobson and DeVanzo estimate that between 2018 and 2026 full ACA repeal with no replacement would lead to: the loss of \$165.8 billion to hospitals due to a loss of insurance coverage, and additional losses of \$289.5 billion if the ACA Medicare reductions are left in place. The report also notes that this could lead to a public health crisis, as well as the closure of certain hospitals.
