CRBR: STUDY FINDS S.C. PORTS AUTHORITY PUMPS \$13.6B INTO MIDLANDS ECONOMY

The **S.C. Ports Authority** drives \$13.6 billion worth of annual economic activity in the Midlands, according to a **new study** released today at the agency's monthly board meeting at the Michelin plant in Lexington.

The study by the University of South Carolina's **Darla Moore School of Business** also found business; the state's ports account for nearly 48,000 jobs in the region and \$2.6 billion in annual labor income.

Additionally, the manufacturing economy, which represents the primary user base of Port facilities, represents 8.2% the economy in the Midlands regions, said Joey Von Nessen, research economist at USC.
