In addition to the above schedule of Budget Hearings the following matters were acted upon by the Board during the above two weeks.

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 29

TAX STUDY COMMITTEE - Allocation from Civil Contingent Fund

Senator Marshall Parker and Mr. Crawford Clarkson, CPA, representing the Tax Study Committee appeared before the Board at 12:00 Noon with a request for an allocation of funds for expenses of the Committee. After hearing the request, the Board approved an immediate allocation from the Civil Contingent Fund of \$3,500.00 with an additional \$4,000.00 to be made available during the remainder of this fiscal year, if so much be necessary.

PROBATION, PAROLE AND PARDON BOARD - Allocation from Civil Contingent Fund

The Board had before it a request from the Probation, Parole and Pardon Board for an allocation of funds for the employment of an additional Probation Officer for their Spartanburg Office. The Board approved the request and allocated \$2,953.76 for salary and \$630.00 for travel expense for the remainder of the year, from November 18, 1963.

DIVISION OF SINKING FUNDS AND PROPERTY

(a) Sinking Fund Loans Approved - The following applications for Sinking Fund Loans were considered by the Board and approved as follows:

(b) Loan Applications Disapproved - The Board considered a request from Anderson County for a loan of \$225,000.00 but rejected the request.

(c) Camp Styx Property - The Board approved the auctioning for sale of 1½ acres of State-owned property in the Camp Styx area, Lexington County.

(d) State Sanatorium - The Board approved the granting of a right-of-way easement to the State Highway Department through property of the South Carolina Sanatorium.

(e) Assignment of Mining Rights - The Board approved the assignment to Pine Hall-Pamona Corporation of mining rights in Jasper County originally granted to J. M. Newlin, of Jasper County.

(f) Fort Moultrie Property - The Board authorized the Director of Sinking Funds and Property to represent the Board in negotiations with Federal authorities regarding the Fort Moultrie property.

(g) Humble Oil Company property - City of Columbia - The Board authorized the Director of Sinking Funds and Property to negotiate with Humble Oil Company for an option to purchase their office building and other facilities located at 300 Gervais Street, in the City of Columbia.

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 6

At the conclusion of Budget Hearings on the afternoon of November 6, the following action was taken by the Board:

DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS - Construction of New Facilities for
Youthful Offenders

The Board gave consideration to an application from the Department of Corrections for approval to proceed with the construction of a new unit of the State Penitentiary designed particularly for youthful offenders. It was noted that the 1963 Session of the General Assembly had made provision for the issuance of \$1,500,000.00 of State Notes to finance the cost of this institution.

Details of architectural plans for the new facilities were submitted by the Department but were not reviewed by the Board at this time.

The Board gave general approval to the Department to proceed as requested with the understanding that the total cost of the institution would not exceed \$1,500,000.00. It was also understood that the facilities would include a cannery as originally proposed.

PROBATION, PAROLE AND PARDON BOARD - Allocation from Civil Contingent Fund

The Board gave consideration to a request for funds for an additional clerk in the Greenville Office of the Probation, Parole and Pardon Board. An allocation of \$1,600.00 for the purpose was approved for the remainder of the current fiscal year, beginning November 18, 1963.



At the meeting of the Budget and Control Board of October 29, 1963, the following was either approved, disapproved or discussed:

- ✓ 2) A loan for Anderson County in the amount of \$225,000 was disapproved. *441,000 - 5 yrs*
- ✓ 3) The Board approved a loan of \$441,000 and a second loan of \$110,000 for Greenville County. *5 yrs*
- ✓ 4) The Board approved the auctioning for sale of 1½ acres of land at the Camp Styx area. *State Board*
- ✓ 5) The Board approved an easement right-of-way for the State Highway Department through the state sanatorium property.
- ✓ 6) Approval of assignment for mining rights from J. M. Newlin of Jasper County to the Pine-Hall Pomona Corporation. *In accord with any agreement - see to be app by Bd.*
- ✓ 7) The Board authorized the Sinking Fund Director to work with the Board of Township Commissioners of Sullivan's Island in connection with Fort Moultrie.
- ✓ 8) Approval of negotiation rights with the Humble Oil Company for an option for their properties on Gervais Street, Columbia, S. C.

Dear Mr. Smith:

We regret to be forced to make the following request so soon after our fiscal year has just begun; however, on July 1 we placed an additional officer in our Greenville Office inasmuch as our case load in Greenville at the time was 1118 for an average of 373 cases per officer. This reduced our case load in the Greenville Area to 279.5. In addition, the Greenville County Public Works had 455 prisoners serving in the several camps who had to be investigated for parole by this same staff.

Though we knew our Spartanburg Office was overloaded we felt that the Greenville situation was more urgent due to the large prison population to be investigated for parole.

We certainly have needed a man in Spartanburg for quite some time and expected to correct this situation in our next budget request; however, we have just learned that Mr. Fred Phillips who worked with this department from July 1, 1957 until September 8, 1961, at which time he was forced to resign due to his health, has after surgery returned to good health and now desires to be reinstated in Spartanburg. Mr. Phillips was an excellent officer and we certainly would be delighted to have him return to our staff.

Our Spartanburg Office has an active case load at the present of 1031 probationers and 129 parolees for a total of 1160 cases, or an average of 386.6 per officer. The Spartanburg County Public Works in addition has 191 prisoners on its Public Works to be investigated for parole.


If it is within the realm of possibility we would appreciate the Budget and Control Board approving sufficient funds, listed below, to reinstate Mr. Phillips which would then reduce our average case load in the Spartanburg Office to 290 per officer which is still three times the national average.

For the above purpose we would certainly be grateful for the sum of \$4,615.39 being added to our Probation Officers Salaries for this fiscal year, effective July 15, and the sum of at least \$500.00 being added to our Travel for our staff for this fiscal year.

Be assured that we shall appreciate your serious consideration of this request.

Dear Governor Russell:

I am writing to you in the interest of our local Probation, Parole and Pardon office here in Spartanburg. In my opinion, it is very much understaffed from the standpoint of probation officers. We have three officers here and are in serious need of one additional officer.

There is a definite morale problem by reason of this shortage of personnel. The officers cannot keep up with their duties by reason of the large number of cases pending. There is 1150 subjects now under the supervision of the Spartanburg office, and this is growing rapidly with each term of General Sessions and County Criminal Courts. There is a tremendous number of non-support cases in this office, and in a number of cases the dependants are not being paid support money, as provided by the courts, by reason of the fact these officers cannot keep up with them. I feel quite sure that the statements made here will be substantiated by Mr. Todd, Director of the South Carolina Probation, Parole and Pardon Board.

I respectfully request that consideration be given by the Budget and Control Board for funds for an additional employee in the Spartanburg office.

I have taken this matter up with Senator Brown and hope so very much the Budget and Control Board will approve this request at its next meeting.

Any consideration you can give me in this matter will be greatly appreciated.
