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The regular monthly meeting of the Department of Transportation Commission was held at the Dorchester County Council Chambers, 500 North Main Street in Summerville, South Carolina at 9:00 a.m. on January 21, 2000. In compliance with the Freedom of Information Act, the news media was advised in writing of the time, date and place of this meeting.

SECTION 1: The Minutes for the meeting of December 16, 1999, copies of which had been previously mailed to each member of the Commission, were approved.

SECTION 2: The Commission unanimously passed a motion authorizing the Department to advertise an RFP to evaluate and select qualified service operators for the Welfare-to-work initiative, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 3: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in extending existing construction contracts to include additional work, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 4: The Commission unanimously passed a motion approving the action of the Department in removing sections of roads from the State Highway System, as shown in detail in the Appendix.

SECTION 5: On motion of Commissioner Goodstein, seconded by Commissioner Hardee, the Commission unanimously passed a motion naming a portion of US 52 from Old Mt. Holly Road in Goose Creek to the intersection with Highway 791 and Highway 1094 in Moncks Corner the "James H. Rozier, Jr. Highway". A copy of the resolution, which is shown in detail in the Appendix, was presented to Mr. Rozier.

SECTION 6: On motion of Commissioner Hardee, seconded by Commissioner Truluck, the Commission unanimously passed a motion to approving a resolution naming the exit on I-126 and Greystone Boulevard, know locally as the "zoo exit", as the "Lawrence W. Johnson, Sr. Interchange", as shown in detail in the Appendix.

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SECTION 7: Chairman Martin called for nominations for the office of First Vice Chairman for the ensuing year. Commissioner Goodstein nominated Commissioner Hardee. The nomination was seconded by Commissioner Atkins. Commissioner Jones then moved that the nominations be closed and that Commissioner Hardee be elected First Vice Chairman by acclamation. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Self. Both motions passed unanimously.

SECTION 8: The next order of business was the election of Second Vice Chairman. Commissioner Hardee nominated Commissioner Truluck. The nomination was seconded by Commissioner Self. Commissioner Atkins then moved the nominations be closed and Commissioner Truluck be elected Second Vice Chairman by acclamation. This motion was seconded by Commissioner Jones. Both motions passed unanimously.

SECTION 9: On motion of Commissioner Jones, seconded by Commissioner Goodstein, the Commission unanimously passed a motion approving a request from Lee County to name a portion of Highway 341 in Lee County the "Martin Luther King, Jr. Highway", as shown in detail in the Appendix.

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SECTION 10: There being no further business to come before the Commission, the meeting was adjourned at 9:50 a.m.

**Request to advertise RFP for the Welfare-to-Work transportation project with the  
SC Employment Security Commission**

The Department requests Commission approval to advertise an RFP to evaluate and select qualified service operators for the Welfare-to-Work initiative. The selected operators will provide workforce transportation services within the 12 Service Delivery Areas (SDA) in South Carolina. This RFP is the next step in the Department's joint effort with the SC Employment Security Commission to increase access to employment opportunities for welfare recipients. The scope of activities may include transportation to and from work locations, to and from job training activities, and supportive transportation services to and from day care facilities if needed.

The total grant amount is \$1.5 million with the expected service period extending through December 31, 2000. As the designated Project Administrator for the Welfare-to-Work Program, the Department will employ the competitive grant process to identify the providers that are capable of assisting in meeting the needs of Welfare-to-Work participants.

**EXTENSION OF CONSTRUCTION CONTRACTS**

It is recommended that the Commission approve the action of the Department in extending existing construction contracts to include additional work, as follows:

**DARLINGTON COUNTY:**

Contract of Jim Lineberger Grading and Paving, Inc. - File 16.80991 - extended to include resurfacing (File No. 16.80991) with asphalt concrete surfacing on Roads S-68 and S-375 for a total of 1.70 miles.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 72,446.48

**EDGEFIELD COUNTY:**

Contract of Satterfield Construction Co., Inc. - File No. 19.80991 - extended to include resurfacing (File 19.80991) with asphalt concrete surfacing on S-58 (Aiken Avenue), S-93 (Addison Street) and S-501 (Sertoma Club Dr.) for 1.03 miles.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 26,551.10

**GREENVILLE COUNTY:**

Contract of Vulcan Construction Materials, LP - File No. 23.10991 - extended to include resurfacing (File No. 23.10991) with asphalt concrete surfacing and pavement markings on S-454 (Hopkins Road) for a total of 0.17 mile.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 9,688.44

**JASPER COUNTY:**

Contract of Rea Construction Company - File No. 27.80991 - extended to include resurfacing (File No. 27.80991) with asphalt concrete surfacing and pavement markings on S-104 in Hardeeville for 0.50 mile.

Estimated Cost of Extension \$ 25,996.50

These extensions were authorized by the Department prior to formal approval by the Commission since the adjacent work had reached such a stage of completion that the contractors involved could not accept the additional work unless it were authorized without delay.




**AND WHEREAS**, he has served as a deacon of First Baptist Church in Columbia since 1972, and has served in all areas of the church's leadership;

## RESOLUTION TO NAME DR. MARTIN LUTHER KING, JR. HIGHWAY


