Today, the Governor issued Executive Order 2014-05 waiving hour restrictions for commercial truck drivers delivering residual oil (industrial oil) throughout the state.

Background: Similar to the way the extreme and extended cold weather has caused delays and backlogs in deliveries for propane (home heating fuel), so too has the weather caused delays in the delivery of industrial fuel. This is why we issued an order for propane earlier and industrial oil today. Georgia has issued an order for propane earlier as well and, as of this afternoon, is also considering an order for industrial oil. We anticipate this being the last order related to cold weather and the backlog of deliveries.
