Spotlight: Coordinating Council for Workforce Development

This week, the South Carolina Coordinating Council for Workforce Development (CCWD) held its second meeting in Columbia, S.C. Established through legislation passed last year, the CCWD is tasked with developing a comprehensive, collaborative workforce development strategy to meet current and future workforce needs.

Chaired by the Secretary of Commerce, the 10-member council includes representation from K-12 education; the technical and community college system; research and four-year universities; workforce and economic development agency directors and presidents; and the private sector. Additionally, the council is seeking input from a newly-formed Business Advisory Committee to assure that the concerns of the business community are taken into account.

As the CCWD continues to meet in the coming months, Team South Carolina will be able to collaborate like never before and ensure that we're providing all existing and future industries with the workforce they need to thrive.

## Commerce Capture: Bob Marriott Retires

This week, long-time S.C. Department of Commerce employee [Bob Marriott](#) retired after more than five decades of service. Starting at S.C. Commerce -- then known as the State Development Board -- in 1968, Marriott worked through the administrations of five different governors. And, during his time as a project manager, he was responsible for recruiting countless significant firms to South Carolina, including globally-recognized firms, such as Cummins, Daimler, Michelin, Mitsubishi Polyester Film, Otis Elevator and TaylorMade. Marriott's projects brought \$8 billion in capital investment and approximately 3,000 new jobs to South Carolina.
