On this past Monday the 6th, the Supreme Court of the United States rejected a Writ of Certiorari to hear any one of five same sex marriage cases pending before the Court. Their inaction let stand the lower courts' rulings thereby granting the proponents of same sex marriage the victory. This will result in the jurisdictions involved recognizing same sex marriage as a reality in thirty states.
